GIBRALTAR Kenneth Palmer will be in Europe for the next three weeks or so and plans operations from both ZB2-Gibraltar and from HV-The Vatican City.

Ken departed last week and should have shown from Gibraltar just before the weekend signing ZB2G. He will be there until March 8th and will be working ten through one-sixty meters. He says to listen for him at:

CW 1827kHz/7010khz/7030kHz/14017kHz/14052kHz/21030kHz and 28017kHz SSB 3798kHz/7095kHz/14185kHzkHz/14215kHz/14280kHz/21235kHz/21295kHz/21355kHz and 28580kHz

On One-Sixty, he will listen at 1802 or 1824Khz. On seventy five meters he will be listening on frequency and above 3800kHz. On his forty meter 7095kHz frequency, he will announce his listening area within the American sub-band and will also listen for c.w. breaks.

On twenty he will listen for c.w. breaks on the 14185kHz frequency, same on the 21235kHz frequency and you can look for him on the Afrikaner Net after 1800Z.

During the ARRL Phone Test on March 3rd and 4th, look for him on forty and eighty meters.

Ken will be at the Vatican City from from March 10th to 17th and is planning to operate HV3SJ. Enroute he was also looking for some possible operating time on the HMS BELFAST moored in the Thames, the callsign there would have been GB2RN or GLHMS.

Working things out to a fine edge so the Deserving will find it a brighter world, he has figured out what should be the best possibilities and these are:

Ten Meters 28017kHz/28580kHz 1400Z to 1800Z with the best possibliity from 1500Z to 1700Z

Fifteen Mtrs 21030/21235/21295/21355kHz 1200Z to 0200Z Best possibility around 1500Z to 1900Z

Twenty Meters 14017/14052/14185/14215/14280kHz 0800Z to 0300Z..Best Possibility 1500Z to 0100Z

Forty Meters 7010/7030/7095kHz 0000Z to 0700Z. Best possibility 0300Z to 0600Z

Eighty Meters 3798kHz 0200Z to 0500Z

AVES The previously announced YVØAA effort on Aves Island has been firmed and is now set for an opening on Saturday, April 28th at about 1200Z. It should run for three days, securing about 0600Z on May 1st.

Frequencies will be:

CW 3525kHz 7025kHz 14025kHz 21025kHz 28025kHz

SSB 3795 7085 14195 21245 & 21295 28495 and 28595kHz

The operators will be announcing their listening frequencies during the operation. There will be ten operators plus a cameraman. Those going on the trip include YV5ANF/YV5AGS/YV5DFI/YV5BQB/YV5ZZ/YV5BNR/YV5ANT/YV3AZC/K2MM and YS1RRD. YV5BUK is the cameraman for the effort. The group will be departing Venezuela on April 26th and you might catch them operating/mm enroute.

Gear includes TR4-Ten-Tec-KWN2-SWAN 1200X-Collins 30L1.....3-element beams for 10/15/20mtrs. Dipoles for forty and eighty and a vertical for One-Sixty. The plan is to try to keep three stations operating and on the air simultaneously. There will also be OSCAR with YV5ZZ active on the satellite.

The call YVØAA is held by the Radio Club Venezolano and QSLs will go to them at Box 2285, Caracas DF, Venezuela. They will need Sae/IRC or a green stamp. This is the same call that the club has used in previous efforts and they are hoping to run up a large total of QSOs on this one.

As of last week things were rather well fixed for the trip. YS1RRD will depart for Caracas on April 25th and will vacation in Florida after the Aves effort.

WILLY De ROOS Willy is enroute towards the Atlantic via Cape Horn and expects to be around Tristan da Cunha in April. His tentative schedule calls for him to be at Tristan da from April 20th to May 1st, at Trinidade and PYØ from May 11th to May 21st. He is also looking for a stop at St Peter and Paul Rocks at the end of June for about a ten day visit and then will head for the Azores, anticipating an arrival there at the end of July.

LUIUN The station has been showing on the Afrikaner Net on Wednesdays, 21355kHz from 1800Z. Sometimes after being on the net for awhile, 4U1UN will QSY to 14020kHz, one Wednesday he went up to 28530kHz. Anyway the station turns, the Afridaner Net on Wednesday might be a good place to lurk in wait......

SUNSPOT LOUIE Things have eased off a bit as the large active areas head towards the western limb. But there is still significant activity and K6EC comes up with a week when the flux was under 200 for only one day, it being at 199.

You can note from NLXX's forecasts that things are getting up to the HN/AN level and sticking there. All things being relative, more or less, you are going to have a hard time supporting any argument that these are not the Great Days of DXing.

Ten meters is staying open late, six meters comes with surprises and K6FV down in the peninsula below San Francisco is looking for great possibilities for six meter DX the rest of the year.

Victor notes that Australian and New Zealand TV audio is being heard on 50.75 and 51.75mHz. It is also noted that the band may often be open for distances of three to four thousand miles but nothing being heard from area in between these points.

For those looking for Pacific DX on two meters, there are a number of stations currently active and these include FO8DR/HL9WI/KG6DX/3D2CM. Efforts are being made to get more six-meter activity in other areas, some efforts in the

past have not been successful, other areas such as HLL/KX6/ZK1 are rumored to be active but no confirmation is available. During the rest of 1979 six meter openings is expected to most of the call areas within the Pacific Basin.

LACCADIVES In January the Bangladore Radio Club made extensive plans for a Laccadives operation and, operating and landing permission in hand, headed for the island group. Things came to a halt when they were not allowed to complete their journey

The problem, as it eventually turned out, was that the official concerned would not allow the group to proceed because he had had no communication from the Indian Union Home Ministry forwarding the permit for the group to proceed.

The group protested that it did have the permission and the approval of the Home Ministry. But it had not come through channels and that was it!!

The Prime Minister of India recent made a trip to the Laccadives, visiting the group for two days. Some of the VUs have speculated that the permission to go to the Laccadives might have been stonewalled because of the pending visit of the Indian Prime Minister to the island group.

Anyhow, the Bangladore Radio Club tried. They probably will regroup, consult the travel schedules and will be looking for another run at VU4. The Laccadives, even though not a really remote area, are getting very high on the needed country lists.

DON MILLER After six days of preliminary hearings, Don Miller and Leroy Freeman were held to answer in the Superior Court to charges of of arson and conspiracy to commit murder. Arrangement is set for this Wednesday, February 28th, in the Indio Superior Court.

Miller was also bound over on two counts of insurance fraud stemming from a fire on last October 6th at his Coachella medical clinic. There are said to be up to twenty two tapes made over a three week period and involving the investigation, one of the tapes being made when Miller talked to an undercover agent from the District Attorney's office.

In the Coachella fire, it is reported that Miller filed claims of \$221,000 with the Aetna Insurance Company and \$300,000 with Industrial Indemnity Company. It is also reported that a truck driver from Indio previously arrested and released in connection with the fire at the clinic has been granted immunity and will be a prosecution witness.

RF6F Heard in the CQ WW DX Tests last Fall with a loud signal, this was an effort of the Radio Club of Voroshilovgrad Obl. region. In the contest the Georgia effort brough a total of 7.8 million in the SSB effort, 5.9 million in the cw effort.

UKSMAF is the club station and they are looking for another special call for the coming WPX Test in March, hoping that CRC will authorized the crew of UK5MAF to sign R5M in the contest. They plan a multi-signal operation.

If you are looking for a QSL from RF6F, you can go via Box 88....or if really thirsting to clutch one in your hot, sweaty hand, you might try via UY5LK....Stan Sichow, Lisichansk-4, Pr. Lenin 135ku27, Voroghilovgradskoy Obl. 349904 USSR. Sae/IRCs will be helpful and you should get a return within a reasonable time.

DESECHEO This one is set to open at sunrise on March 5th and run to sunset on March 7th.

For those who need the approximate times, 1000Z is expected to be the opening time and close-down about 2200Z. By the time the operation has run its course you should have a definite close down time.

Look for the group signing KP4AM on c.w. twenty kHz up from the lower band edge. On SSB look for them at 3798kHz/7195kHz/14202kHz/21265kHz and 28502kHz. They said thy hoped to have a linear and a beam and to operate around-the-clock though it was not clear if this did include the night periods on the island.

WHLAAA on Midway will be on this weekend's contest only for a brief period.but...listen for him at 0800Z on One-Sixty.....transmitting at 1998kHz and listening down around 1810kHz. He will show both days for only fifteen minutes or so. From one-sixty he will QSY to 3895kHz.....that's the right frequency as he is a General Class licensee. QSLs to W5RU.

WA1SQB will be in the Turks & Caicos signing VP5HX for the CQ WPX Test on March 24/25th. Chod was also signing VP2SE recently. On Saturdays AJ2E is often found at 28785kHz from 1300Z taking a list for A4XFE....who shows about a half hour later. VP8SU on South Georgia is a commercial operator, likes c.w. and should be there for a long tour. He has been showing around 14275kHz from 2000Z.

WD8IXV, Mark Blau, is looking for some QSL duties for a DX station. Says he enjoys QSLing. WAØTKJ, who is currently handling the QSLs for 9V1TE, says that he also is looking for more business.

ZM5AB was going blue blazes with a list operation on the low end of twenty phone a week or so back ... a true-blue ZM would be one of the New Zealand types. Anyhow, he was giving W3KT as the QSL Manager. W3KT came up on frequency....the ZM5AB split for other parts. Sure shows how some fellows can't get along with their QSI Manager.

John Kanode, NhMM, has split from his duties with the W4 QSL bureau after four years toiling in the Wh-vineyards. John was handling Wh/Kh/Nh portions of the callsigns. John Boyd, WLWG, has taken over the chores from NLMM and the address continues as beford. The National Capitol DX Assn is the sponsor.

Elsewhere you will note a report on the January plans for the Laccadives by the Bangladore Radio Club. Actually, they have not given up hope and are still probing for possibly something in March. After March the weather is not favorable and if they are not able to come up with something then, it probably will not show until next December. VU2TS says that they are definitely still looking for something and are still hopeful that VULARC will show before long.

EP2LI will be at Fresno for the big International DX meeting set for the April 7/8th weekend. There is a revolution going on in Chad and TT8 may be something a bit hard to find. Everytime there is an upheaval, Libya moves the border a couple of miles further south and this upsets a lot of people.

The book on propagation published by Cowan, "The SHORTWAVE PROPAGATION HANDBOOK" showed a couple of weeks back and looks good. This is the one by George Jacobs, W3ASK, and Ted Cohen, NLXX. Elsewhere we may be running a short ad on this book, if you don't find it, check last week's issue. Those who have seen the book say it is good.

ZD9GH says to look for him Monday/Tuesday and Thursdays.....14230kHz or 21320kHz from 1900Z. QSLs go to either ZS1PR or ZS1Z.
